

A PROPHET LIKE MOSES (Dt. 18:18)

Moses

Born under an oppressive, foreign rule. (Ex. 1:8-11)

A wicked king declared Moses and other male Jewish children be killed. (Ex. 1:15-16)

Moses' life was saved and preserved through the faith of his parents. (Ex. 2:2; Heb. 11:23)

Moses received protection for a time in Egypt. (Ex. 2:10)

There were people trying to compete with Moses because of his wisdom. (Nu. 12:1-3)

Rejected for a time by the people of Israel. (Ex. 32:1)

Rejected by the Jews but accepted by the Gentiles. (Ex. 2:13-15, 21)

Married a Cushite – a black African woman and criticized by his family for taking a Gentile wife. (Nu. 12:1)

Prayed to God to forgive the sins of the people and was willing to bear the consequences of their sin and guilt. (Ex. 32:21-32)

Jesus

Born under an oppressive, foreign rule. (Lk. 2:1-2)

A wicked king declared Jesus and other male Jewish children be killed. (Mt. 3:16)

Jesus' life was saved and preserved through the faith of his parents. (Mt. 2:13-14)

Jesus received protection for a time in Egypt. (Mt. 2:14-15)

From His youth Jesus demonstrated tremendous wisdom and understanding and others wanted to compete with Him but could not do it. (Lk. 2:46-47)

Rejected for a time by the people of Israel. (Mt. 27:21-22; Mt. 23:39; Rom. 11:25)

Rejected by the Jews but accepted by the Gentiles. (Is. 65:1, 13-15)

Jewish people criticize Jesus because, in figure or type, He took a mainly Gentile wife, the church. (Mk. 3:20-21) The book of Ruth is read in the synagogues on the day of Pentecost, a story about a Jewish man taking a Gentile wife and a baby born in Bethlehem was called "the redeemer".

Prayed to God to forgive the sins of the people and was willing to receive the consequences of their sin and guilt. (Lk. 23:34; 1 Pe. 2:21-24)

Fasted for forty days and forty nights to bring a covenant to God's people. (Ex. 34:28)

Had a face-to-face relationship with God. (Dt. 34:10)

When Moses met God face-to-face he glowed supernaturally. (Ex. 34:34-35)

In Exodus God spoke to Moses directly from heaven and a voice was heard.

An angel guarded the tomb of Moses. (Jude 9)

Revealed God's name to God's people. (Ex. 3:13-14)

Supernaturally fed God's people in large numbers. (Ex. 16:14-15)

Performed miracles, signs and wonders as no other man before him had ever done. (Dt. 34:10-12)

Went to a mountain, made a covenant with blood, and covered God's people with that blood. (Ex. 24:7-8)

Fasted forty days and forty nights to bring a covenant to God's people. (Mt. 4:2)

Had a face-to-face relationship with God. (Jn. 1:18)

Like Moses, Jesus glowed supernaturally. (Mt. 17:2)

God spoke directly to Jesus from heaven. (Jn. 12:23, 28)

An angel guarded Jesus' tomb. (Mt. 28:2-6)

Revealed God's name to God's people. (Lk. 17:6, 11, 12)

Supernaturally fed God's people in large numbers. (Mt. 14:19-20)

Performed works, signs, wonders and miracles as no one else has ever done. (Jn. 5:36)

Went to a mountain, made a covenant with blood, and covered His people with that blood. (Heb. 9:11-12)
