## Walk With the Word

Leviticus 1-7

"The Proper Response to God in Their Midst"

In Exodus 40, God came to dwell in the midst of the Israelites. This *shekinah* glory dwelt in the Tabernacle; specifically, the Holy of Holies, over the Ark of the Covenant. In the form of the *metatron*, or pre-incarnate Christ, God, quite literally, came to dwell in their midst.

Leviticus 1-7 clearly outlines the proper human response to God dwelling in their midst. For the Israelites, God dictated that the response should be in a form they could easily identify with – ritualistic sacrifices, something their ancestors had participated in (e.g., Abraham), and something they had witnessed in Egypt.
