Genesis 35:1-21 • The Struggle for Spiritual Purity

- 1. (v.1) Past issues of <u>anger</u> may have future <u>consequences</u>.
- 2. (v.2-3) Issues of spiritual <u>purity</u> always extend to those closest to us who have the most earthly <u>influence</u> over us.
- 3. (v.4-5) One of the consequences of past issues in our life may be a <u>reputation</u> that has an adverse effect on <u>others</u>.
- 4. (v.6-15) Another consequence may be personal <u>doubt</u> that past issues have somehow nullified God's <u>promises</u>.
- 5. (v.16-21) There may always be <u>forgiveness</u>, but that does not always erase subsequent <u>consequences</u>.

Some of the ways God redeemed bad situations in this chapter and turned them into something of value:

- Just like in Abraham's case, God used an incident to create a
 healthy <u>fear</u> in the people around him who might be jealous or
 envious of his <u>prosperity</u>.
- God used the previous incidents of chapter 34 to cause Jacob to finally do something about the idolatry in his midst.
- God used the flight to Bethel to <u>reaffirm</u> the Abrahamic Covenant and to <u>reinforce</u> Jacob's name change.
