Exodus 18:13-26 • The Old Testament Roots of Discipleship

1. ((v.13-16) It begins with	someone who	knows	God's Word

- 2. (v.17-20) The goal of biblical discipleship:
 - a. To apply God's <u>Word</u> as an agent of change in one's <u>behavior</u>, what Scripture often calls "<u>faith</u>". (v.20)
 - To put God's <u>Word</u> into practice in one's <u>actions</u> and <u>service</u>. (v.20)
- (v.21-23) Rather than according to <u>earthly</u> standards, biblical leaders are characterized not just by superior <u>skills</u> and <u>knowledge</u>, but superior spiritual and moral <u>character</u>.

4. (v.24-26) Whether an issue is difficult or routine, the answer is still found in <u>God's Word</u>.
