## Psalm 34 • How to Fear the Lord

- 1. (v.1-3) <u>Praise</u> is the most visible sign of our <u>respect</u> and <u>fear</u> of the Lord.
- 2. (v.4-7) We are always in the center of His protection.
- (v.8-14) To fear the Lord first begins with an attitude of <u>praise</u>, reinforced by living according to the knowledge of always being in His <u>protection</u>, and bringing one's place, attitude, and heart into <u>obedience</u> to Him.
- 4. (v.15-18) Biblical fear understands that the Lord is always present regardless of how we are living.
- 5. (v.19-22) In the end, God lifts up those who <u>choose</u> Him and brings down those who <u>do not</u>.

## Summary:

- Biblical "fear" begins with a heart that continually <u>praises</u> Him both in the <u>inner man</u> and visibly by encouraging <u>others</u> to do the same.
- Biblical "fear" is built out of our commitment to seek and remain in His <u>protection</u>, to take up <u>refuge</u> in Him rather than the <u>world</u>.
- Biblical "fear" is the result of following through with personal obedience.
- Biblical "fear" is born out by what the <u>Lord</u> does, how differently He treats those who <u>follow</u> Him completely and those who do not.
