## Isaiah 30:1-26 • When It All Goes South

- (v.1-5) Placing a higher priority in something other than Christ always works until times of <u>testing</u> and <u>trials</u>, at which time the true strength/weakness of both our <u>trust</u> and the object of that <u>trust</u> is exposed.
- (v.6-7) The unspoken truth of our seeking <u>comfort</u> and <u>protection</u> is that we ourselves cannot provide it and must seek something <u>greater</u> that can; <u>deception</u> is believing something else can.
- (v.8-11) Rebellion is always accompanied and evidenced by a rejection of <u>God's Word</u>. This is why alternate alliances are attempted, because they say the things those who reject <u>God's</u> <u>Word</u> want to hear in place of <u>God's Word</u>.
- 4. (v.12-14) Rebellion is like all other <u>addictive</u> behaviors it takes a traumatic, rock-bottom <u>experience</u> to get the person to realize the true nature of their misplaced <u>confidence</u>.
- 5. (v.15-17) The resulting <u>lesson</u> learned at one's personal expense will be a very public <u>warning</u> to everyone else about them.
- (v.18-22) True <u>repentance</u> must be accompanied by a true commitment to God's Word to change one's <u>behavior</u> permanently and irrevocably.
- 7. (v.23-26) Even at their momentary best, a substitute for God could only provide a very <u>temporary</u> benefit and could never provide the spiritual <u>assurance</u> we need both for this <u>life</u> and the next.
