Zephaniah 3 • Restoration of Israel

Part One: People's Behavior

- (v.1-2) The rebellious are biblically "defiled" because they are no longer spiritually <u>pure</u> and fit for His <u>service</u> as they once were. They become self-absorbed <u>tyrants</u> seeking to rule others in <u>God's</u> place.
- (v.3-4) The rebellious get the <u>leaders</u> they deserve who lead away from <u>God's</u> path of eternal life to the <u>world's</u> path of inevitable destruction.
- 3. (v.5) God cannot, forever, <u>abide</u> the what results from <u>rebellion</u>.
- 4. (v.6-7) Rebellion is not just a <u>behavior</u>, but a <u>lifestyle</u> in direct contradiction to God's <u>preferences</u>.

Part Two: God's Response

- 5. (v.8) Everything <u>defiled</u> must be gathered together and <u>destroyed</u>.
- 6. (v.9) The opposite of rebellion is **faithfulness** to God's Word and ways. God always maintains a **faithful** remnant.
- 7. (v.10) God's remnant <u>maintains</u> the right spiritual condition necessary to <u>serve</u> Him in His presence, what He calls "<u>My worshipers"</u>.
- 8. (v.11-13) God will work spiritual <u>renewal</u> among those who seek to never leave His <u>presence</u> or <u>ways</u>.

Part Three: Restoration

- 9. The physical return of Israel is a prelude to the greater sign of their spiritual return.
- 10. (v.18-20) The faithful remnant restores <u>service</u> to God the way it should be because they <u>serve</u> Him from the <u>heart</u>. They are more concerned for "<u>Zion</u>" than "<u>Israel</u>".
