Zechariah 4 • The Work of the Spirit

1. (v.1-10) Biblically a lamp is often the metaphor for <u>God's Word</u> and oil the <u>anointing</u> of the Holy Spirit. When combined with the repeated use of a plumb line to represent something being measured against the standard of <u>God's Word</u>, we see that Holy Spirit is at work bringing everything into <u>alignment</u> with God's Word and ways in spite of how it may appear from an earthly perspective. Being more concerned with quality than quantity, it is faithfulness in the <u>small</u> things which lead to accomplishing the <u>greater</u> achievements of the Kingdom.

2. (v.11-14) Just as God the <u>Son</u> was depicted in the previous vision in His dual work in both the heavenly and the earthly realms, so here the work of God the <u>Spirit</u> is likewise illuminated. That there is an anointing of the <u>Spirit</u> is sometimes an extension of His <u>role</u> to ensure that God's <u>work</u> is brought to <u>completion</u>.

3. **Overall**: What is seen here is a microcosm of Scripture's overall, greater teaching of the <u>role</u> of the Holy Spirit to always point to **Christ** and see to the **completion** of His Word and ways.
