1 Corinthians 3 • One Work, Many Servants

- (v.1-5) Spiritual leaders are not <u>dictators</u>, but <u>servants</u> whose goal is producing spiritual <u>maturity</u>, defined biblically as quality <u>relationships</u>.
- 2. (v. 6-9) Spiritual leaders are not <u>specialists</u> independent from everyone else, but <u>co-laborers</u> with skills that can only be fully realized as part of the <u>whole team</u>.
- (v.10-17) Spiritual leaders are ultimately judged according to the spiritual <u>quality</u> of their <u>results</u>, whether <u>eternal</u> for rewards, <u>temporal</u> for a loss of all except their salvation, or <u>permanently</u> should they be revealed to actually be false shepherds.
- (v.18-23) Spiritual leaders never claim it is "their" church alone, but facilitate everyone's understanding that "all things belong to you".

Overall Application

- As God's field, we are to receive the Word of God <u>implanted</u> in us and <u>bear</u> spiritual fruit.
- As God's temple, we are to be built with spiritually lasting materials for the glory of God.
- Each of us, regardless of office or gift, are making **contributions**, be they gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay or straw.
- But the ultimate quality of our work, which speaks to our level of spiritual maturity, is found in the quality of our personal relationships.
