1 Corinthians 5 • Correcting the Worst Case Scenario

- (v.1-5) To willfully ignore <u>unaddressed</u> sin in fellow believers creates an issue of <u>sin</u> for the body at large. It is not an issue about a single <u>mistake</u> but a <u>lifestyle</u>.
- (v.6-8) Just as each individual believer is a visible <u>testimony</u> to the world, so is the whole <u>Body of Christ</u>; just as individual <u>hearts</u> are to be intolerant of allowing sin permanent residence, so too the <u>Church</u>.
- 3. (v.9-13) Church discipline is supposed to serve as a <u>testimony</u> to the world and a <u>warning</u> to the Church that God expects His children to be <u>different</u> from the world.
 - a. What the biblically "wicked" all have in common:
 - 1) They rebel against **authority**.
 - 2) The rebel against God's Word.
 - 3) They engage in activities harmful to others.
 - 4) They live <u>contrary</u> to what both God and the world expect.
- 4. Overall Application
 - a. Believers identified in Scripture who should not be permitted to fellowship in the local church:
 - 1) The member who will not settle <u>personal</u> differences. (Mt. 18:15-17)

- 2) The member who claims to be a Christian but does not live at all like one to the **detriment** of others. (1 Co. 5:8-11)
- 3) The member who holds to <u>false doctrine</u>. (1 Ti. 1:18-20; 2 Ti. 2:17-18)
- 4) The member who causes <u>divisions</u>. (Titus 3:10-11)
- 5) The member who refuse to work for a living. (2 Th. 3:6-12)
- b. The common denominator is they continue to live in the character of their old, <u>unregenerate</u> life.
- c. It is not about a single sin, but a lifestyle. (Gal. 6:1)
- d. In Jesus' day Judaism became ineffectual because of the hypocrisy among God's people; today Christianity is no longer salt and light because of hypocrisy.
